


Ride On

Therapeutic Horsemanship



Serving the San Fernando and Conejo Valleys

Annual Report 2010

Ride On specializes in therapeutic horseback riding. We teach riding skills to children and adults with mental and physical disabilities and we provide physical and occupational therapy using the movement of the horse to improve specific medical conditions. Ride On has now given over 58,000 lessons in our 16-year history - improving the quality of life in our community one ride at a time.

In 2010, Ride On gave over 4,700 lessons and physical therapy treatments to an average of 150 clients on a weekly basis. Ride On subsidizes the cost of riding lessons for all participants. Beyond that, Ride On gave scholarships ranging from free lessons to ½ price for 860 lessons or treatments, about 20% of all lessons. Ride On provided nearly 800 physical or occupational therapy treatments, or Hippotherapy. Ride On is the only national accredited provider of Hippotherapy in all of Los Angeles or Ventura County.


75% of our riders were children age 18 and under: 50% are physically and 50% are mentally disabled. Many of these riders have multiple disabilities requiring extensive staff and volunteer support. Our staff includes 8 certified instructors, 6 therapists and 30 horses. Over 120 volunteers each week donated over 12,000 hours of work. Ride On's senior staff has over 100 years experience combining the benefits of horses and riding for the disabled. All of the senior staff is involved in teaching or certifying other professionals at workshops held throughout the year.

About 90 cents of each dollar raised went directly to put individuals with special needs on horseback. Our horses are both wonderful and vital to our success. Ride On spent over \$70,000 feeding and caring for them. 16 individuals gave \$2,500 horse sponsorships to help defray these costs.

Ride On opened its new 3-acre ranch in Chatsworth in March. This facility will provide a permanent home for our riders in the San Fernando Valley. Ride On has raised over \$850,000 towards a \$2.1 million goal for the first phase of acquiring and developing this ranch from the Ahmanson Foundation, Weingart Foundation, Cobin Family Foundation and private Ride On supporters.

Ride On received support from many other foundations and groups during 2010. We received a \$400,000 grant from the City of Los Angeles which will fund a large portion of an education building; we also received a \$40,000 grant from the Amerman Foundation allowing us to install accessible footing at the Chatsworth location. We received a donation of sound equipment from JBL Professional, continued support from Variety, the Children's Charity in the amount of \$20,000, a \$5,000 donation from the Reel Cowboys and \$8,500 from Maple Elementary PFA.

Ride On completed nine years partnering with the Conejo Recreation and Park District which donates the lease of a 13-acre park site for our home in Newbury Park. Other popular activities in 2010 were our Ride On-hosted CALNET horseshow and summer camps for the able-bodied and disabled.
