Lori Garone, PT, HPCS

Lori is a physical therapist, licensed in New York, New Jersey and California and a board certified Clinical Specialist in Hippotherapy. A 1990 graduate of Touro School of Health Sciences, Lori earned her Masters Degree in PT. She served two terms on the AHA Board of Directors, most recently as Vice President, Chair of the Education Curriculum Development and Nominating Committees. Lori previously served as Education Committee Chair (2001-2005) and Practice and Standards Chair (2001-2008). Lori was chosen to represent the USA in 1991 at the First Symposium of Physiotherapists and Riding Instructors in Surrey, England. Lori has trained successfully up to Fourth Level Dressage and is a life long horsewoman. As Clinical Director at Sullivan Diagnostic and Testing Center, she helped develop The Center for Discovery's Milligan Hill EAAT Program, incorporating hippotherapy into patients plan of care as well as Equine Assisted Therapy and Activities incorporating the environment of the horse for residential patients, daycare program and work related experiences. From 2005-2007, Lori served as Interim Executive Director and Program Director at The National Center for Equine Facilitated Therapy. In 2010 she was awarded the Oyster Bay, NY Woman of the Year Award for her work in the Health Industry and promoting Hippotherapy. Since 1990, Lori has had a private practice on Long Island, NY, *Physical Therapy in Motion*, where she incorporates hippotherapy into her patients plan of care.

In 2007 Nancy was the recipient of the NARHA James Brady Professional Achievement Award.

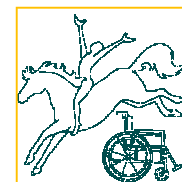

Course Description

With extensive use of patient videos, group discussion and problem solving, course participants will explore the theoretical and scientific rationale and benefits for using hippotherapy, alone and in combination with other treatment strategies for specific neurologic impairments such as: spasticity, impaired motor control and sensory deficits. In addition, participants will discuss ways to incorporate principles of neuroplasticity and motor learning into their hippotherapy session.

- Review of major relevant areas of the Central Nervous System
- Common impairments related to motor behavior
- Theoretical and scientific rationale for treatment of neurological patients
- Related systems - treating the whole patient
- Therapist treatment approaches - combining clinic and Hippotherapy
- Applying principles of motor learning and neuroplasticity in Hippotherapy
- Patient problem solving using videos of patients with neurologic impairments

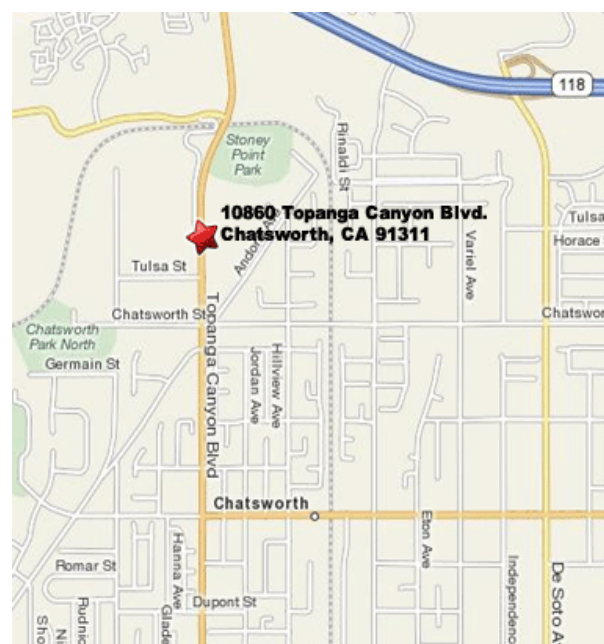
